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Healthcare Providers Improve Approach To Treat Those with Chest Pain

On the morning of April 21, shoppers at Russellville Wal-Mart may have witnessed a bit of unexpected excitement. Logan Memorial Hospital along with Logan County EMS staged a public medical drill. A chest pain drill was held to measure response times and practice medical protocol.

The drill began with the "patient" Judge Executive Logan Chick calling 911 complaining of chest pain. Emergency Medical Services responded, assessed the "patient's" symptoms, began treatment and quickly moved the "patient" to Logan Memorial Hospital.

Logan Memorial Hospital recently joined the Saint Thomas Chest Pain Network and is in the process of

obtaining Chest Pain Accreditation from the Society of Chest Pain Centers. The drill was held to see how quickly the hospital handles patients with symptoms consistent with a heart attack and identify opportunities for improvement. One such opportunity is the ability to partner with EMS and have the hospital monitor patients before arrival to Logan Memorial.

Beginning mid-June, Logan EMS will begin using LIFENET (story on page 2), which will provide Emergency Room physicians the capability to monitor the patient before arriving at the hospital. This translates to quicker diagnosis and treatment, which is especially important considering some areas of our market are 30 to 45 minutes from Logan Memorial.

LOGAN MEMORIAL HOSPITAL LAUNCHES NEW SYSTEM TO HELP IMPROVE HEART ATTACK PATIENT OUTCOMES



The LIFENET System is the first web-based data network of its kind, offering EMS and hospital teams tools to work together to help improve both clinical and operational efficiencies. The use of this system will allow Logan Memorial to reduce time to treatment, known as door-to-balloon time (D2B), for patients who experience a dangerous type of heart attack known as STEMI (ST-segment elevation myocardial infarction). LIFENET System is a state-of-the-art system designed to connect EMS teams and hospital personnel with emergent patient data, and to help increase workflow so that a patient can receive treatment as quickly as possible. LIFENET enables paramedics in the field to alert hospital care teams and provide them with critical patient data so they can quickly identify STEMI patients, determine where to route them for care, and have staff prepared before the patient arrives, reducing time to treatment. This is all managed by a secure web-based system.
